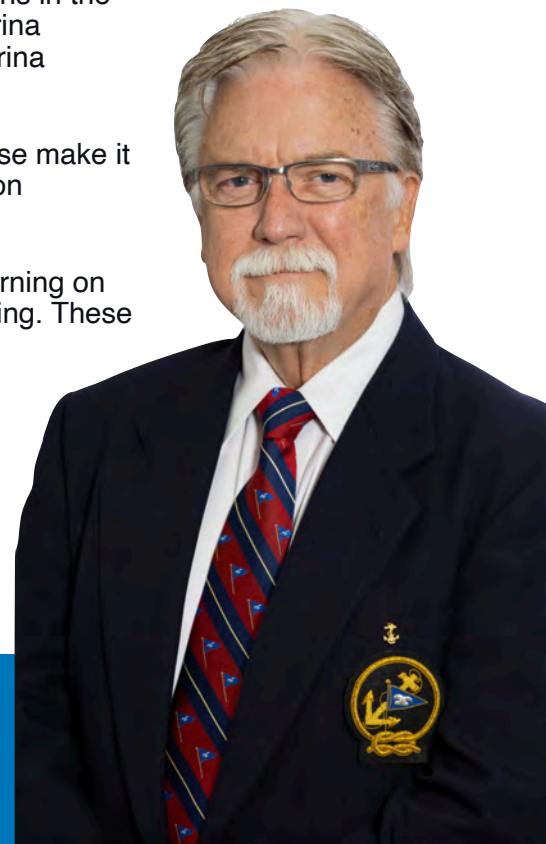

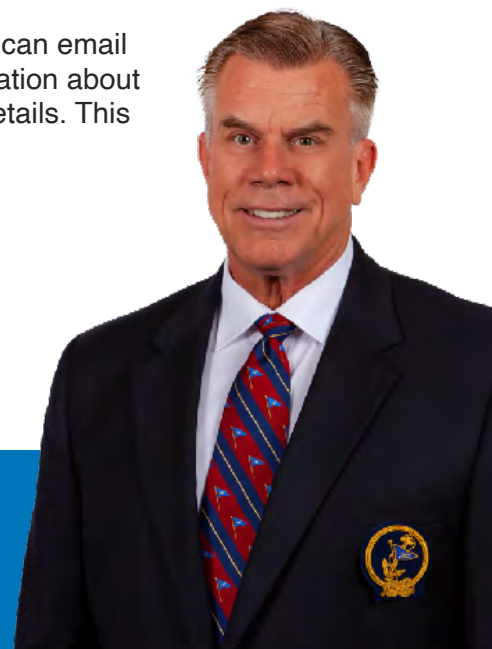

The first two months of FY 2024 have been financially steady, with break even profit. Good for the slow winter months. We have been able to steadily fund the Capital Improvement Fund, bringing investments in line with the balance sheet account by the end of February at \$460,000.

We have prepared our final (pre-audit) financial results for 2023. Below, I have provided some of the most important figures from the year-end financials, comparing them to 2022. If you wish to receive more complete financials for the year, please contact Karina or me, and we will send you the details.

In many ways, 2023 figures are similar to 2022 figures but have different explanations. 2023 revenue was bolstered by the assessment of \$166,000, while 2022 included \$101,000 of COVID federal subsidy.

Much of the revenue and net income increase comes from the \$65,000 difference between those funding sources.

In addition, our fixed assets went up by \$647,000, with the construction of C Dock offset by the depreciation of our older assets. Our long-term debt is up over \$260,000, with the C Dock loan partially offset by almost \$290,000 in principal payments made on the original acquisition and construction loan and the A Dock loan. Both older loans will be paid off next month. Even with the payments on the new loan, our debt service will be down by about \$8,000 per month starting in April.

The FAC met mid-February, and the discussion centered on future capital projects. The club will update the Reserve Study, which looks at our facilities and estimates the remaining life before significant repairs or replacements are required.

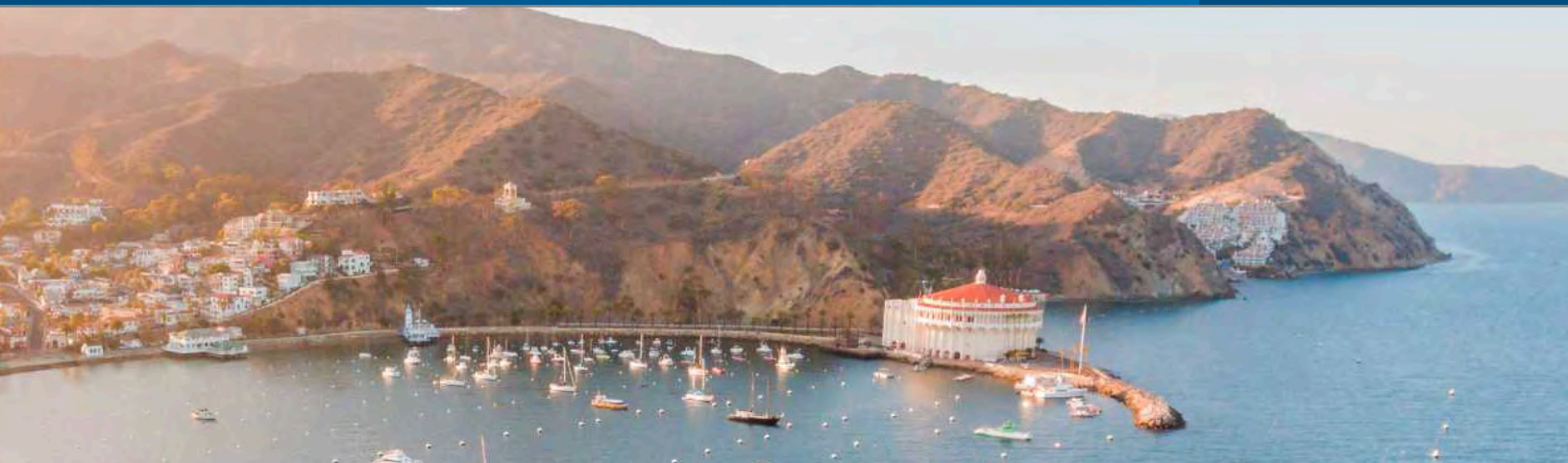

Happy St. Patrick's. I leave you with an Irish Proverb. “May the hinges of our friendship never grow rusty.”



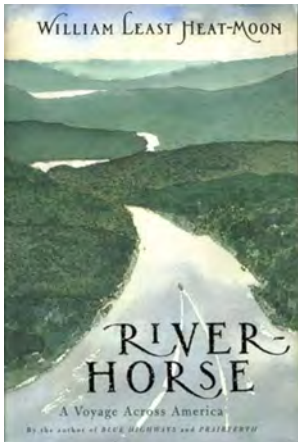

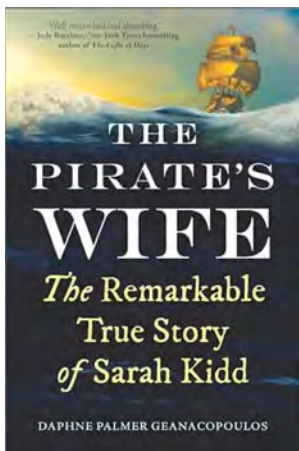

River Horse: A Voyage Across America - William Least Heat-Moon

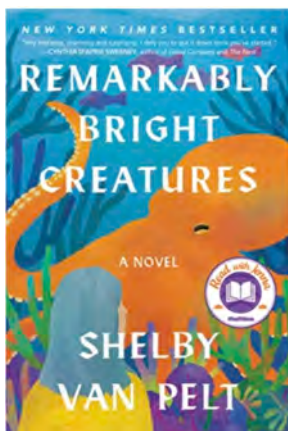

The Pirate's Wife: The Remarkable True Story of Sarah Kidd-Daphne Palmer Geanakopoulou

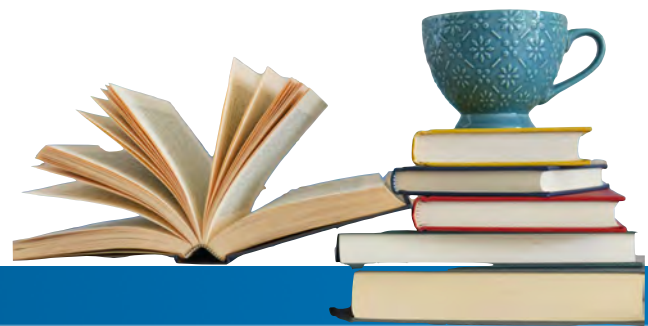
