

For the past several months your carpet committee, Deb Goelz, Linda Plambeck, Anna Paul, Chris Whitacre, and I have diligently been working on choosing the new carpet and flooring for our Club. At the May luncheon, we presented our selections to you. Lots of questions were asked and answered. A Motion to Approve was made, and the vote was yes to accept the proposed carpet and LVP flooring for the dance area in the bar.

At the May CCYC Board of Directors meeting, the carpet committee and I again presented our selections. The Commodore thanked the committee for all their hard work in getting a consensus for a new design plan for the Club. The BOD approved the carpet for installation throughout the dining room, Lipton Cup room, reception area and the BOD room.

However, the Burgee Bar and Lounge concept was not approved by the BOD, but rather put on hold. It was their decision to look into removing all the flooring in the bar and lounge area, including the ceramic tile, and install a single color LVP flooring to improve safety (eliminate uneven flooring heights), as well as add more versatility to our overall room set-up capabilities. Any acoustical issues will also be addressed. The Bridge is looking into colors for the LVP flooring and will present their findings at the next BOD meeting in June.

Once approved by the CCYC BOD, installation will be coordinated with GM Dan Parker in order to have all the flooring throughout the Club finished in the same time frame. It is everyone's hope this project can be completed by mid-July. Either way, the new decor will be stunning and C-Gulls can add another feather to our cap!

We are still looking for volunteers to head up the October and November luncheons. Think about what type of event you would like to attend and then run with it. Let Carmen or Deb know, as new ideas are the best and there are lots of us to help you!




CCYC Nautical Book Club



The Sea Detective - Mark Douglas-Home



Swimming to Antarctica - Lynne Cox

Lynne Cox writes about swimming the way Saint-Exupery wrote about flying, and one sees how swimming, like flying, can stretch the wings of the spirit. At 14, she swam 26 miles from Catalina Island to the mainland; at 15 & 16, she broke the men's and women's world records for swimming the English Channel; at 18, she swam the 20-mile Cook Strait between North and South Islands of New Zealand. She was the first to swim the Strait of Magellan (the world's most treacherous 3-mile stretch of water), the Bering Strait from Alaska to Siberia (opening the U.S.-Soviet border for the first time in 48 years), and the Cape of Good Hope. And finally she is the first person to have swum a mile in zero degree water in Antarctica.

Island Dreaming... Greek Horiatiki

CCYC is an island unto itself so here is a little Greek Island inspiration! This authentic recipe will capture our taste buds and is real 'eye candy' if you are entertaining. Crunchy, fresh, juicy and filled with flavor...and it just may put you in the mood for a Greek Island adventure! It brought back wonderful memories for me.

Ingredients: One salad - Serves two

- 3 ripe tomatoes cut into large wedges
- ► 1 medium English cucumber peeled and sliced into large ½ inch slices
- One dozen pitted Greek Kalamata black olives
- ▶ 1 small red onion, sliced thinly
- ▶ ½ small green bell pepper sliced thinly
- ▶ 1 large chunk of feta cheese (3 ounces)
- ► ½ cup good quality Extra Virgin Olive Oil (the extra is for drizzling)
- ▶ 1 tsp dried Greek or Mediterranean oregano
- ▶ 3 tbsp red wine vinegar
- Kosher salt
- Capers
- ▶ 1/2 packet sweet and low

Directions:

Dressing:

Mix together 1/4 cup olive oil with the red wine vinegar, Kosher salt and oregano, and sweet and low.

Salad:

Plate the ingredients starting with the tomatoes and cucumber on the bottom. Drizzle some of the dressing next. Then add the onions and peppers along with the olives. Place the feta cheese along the sides. Drizzle more dressing. Add lemon zest!
