have two positive things to report this month. First, it is with great pleasure that I announce many of this year's capital improvements are complete. As you recall, several months ago we had an assessment to fix our deteriorating roof, discovered sink holes near our sea wall, and the need to repair our parking lot. After receiving several bids, we contracted with RC Roofing, Dalinghaus Construction, and American Asphalt. Each company did an amazing job, coming in below their quotes and ahead of schedule. The Treasurer has reported that all of the work came in approximately \$30K under budget. These funds will be transferred into our Reserve Account for future capital improvements and not placed into our operating budget.

I would also like to report that we are finalizing the terms of our future sublease for the neighboring grass area and bocce court. CCYC's property line ends just a few feet east of our clubhouse. The remaining area is leased from another leaseholder. Our current sublease for the grass area and bocce court expires in August. We have been in negotiations to renew the sublease with more favorable terms for CCYC. Negotiations have been going well and the Board hopes to review and vote on the new lease in the coming weeks. Our main goals are to secure parking and much of the

existing subleased area in the event the leaseholder gets approved to build his RV Resort. Once we have the details, I will schedule another **Coffee with the Commodore** to let our membership know the details. I hope to see you all around the Club as we enjoy our Coronado Summer!

On Around the Water

WHEN YOUR CREW BECOMES CAPTAIN

would like to thank *Bill Barsz* for passing along this important list of safety information that will be valuable to all captains. This list was written by *John Jourdane* who is one of the most experienced offshore sailors in the world today. He is also an accomplished author.

SAFETY CHECKLIST FOR YOUR CREW —John Jourdane

As the skipper of the boat I'm sure you can do all the following, but what if you go overboard or become ill, unconscious, or incapacitated? Ideally, someone on the boat has been properly trained to take over—the question is, can this person perform the following in an emergency?

- 1. Stop the boat?
- 2. Lower the sails?
- 3. Steer a compass course?
- 4. Engage and set a course on the autopilot?
- 5. Start and stop the engine?
- 6. Drop and raise the anchor?
- 7. Determine the latitude and longitude of the boat's current position?
- 8. Read the chart plotter and use AlS?
- 9. Use the VHF radio to call another boat or the Coast Guard and send a DSC message (Digital Selective Calling)?
- 10. Know how to call for help (send a MAYDAY, Pan-Pan, or Security message?)
- 11. Know how to set off an EPIRB or Personal Locator Beacon?
- 12. Know how to deploy and use the Lifesling?
- 13. Know how to release the MOM or Man Overboard pole?
- 14. Know how to put on a PFD, crotch straps, and use tethers?
- 15. Know where the flares are and how to use them?
- 16. Know where the fire extinguishers are and how to use them?
- 17. Know where the first aid kit is and how to use it?
- 18. Know how to turn the propane or butane gas on and off?

I know it sounds like a tall order, but it might be wise to seek out and/or train a qualified *First Mate* - especially if you plan to leave the bay!

Red, White & Blue Raft-Up Salad

Here is that perfect summer salad loaded with an explosion of flavor coming from crispy bacon and blue cheese. This is a wonderful side salad to bring to a **4**th of July Raft–Up. There are no eggs and no mayonnaise so it will last half the day – except that it will disappear quickly – even though it tastes *even better* the next day.

Carole's Tip: Use Roquefort or Danish Blue—yummm!

Ingredients: -

- 3 lbs. Yukon or Red potatoes peeled, cubed and then boiled (about 20 minutes)
- 8 strips Bacon I cook mine in oven
- 4.5 oz Roquefort or Danish blue cheese crumbled
- 1 cup chopped parsley
- 2 cups sliced celery
- 4 green onions -chopped
- 2 tsp fresh thyme leaves

Dressing: ——

- 2 tbsp. Apple cider vinegar
- 2 tbsp fresh lemon juice
- 2 tsp dijon mustard
- 1 tsp Kosher salt
- Lots of freshly ground pepper
- ▶ ¹/₂ cu olive oil
- 3/4 cup blue cheese or ranch salad dressing (*** see note)
- ▶ ¹/₂ cup sour cream

*** if you are not concerned about not using mayonnaise, I would substitute the blue cheese dressing with ¾ cup mayonnaise.

Directions: -

- 1.Cook 8 strips of bacon and set aside.
- 2.Combine the ingredients for the dressing-whisking well after each addition
- 3.Cube & boil potatoes until fork tender and drain (20-25 minutes)
- 4.Add potatoes into prepared dressing
- 5.Fold everything together, serve it up 'buddha bowl style' and toss table-side, or store in a sealed container and pop in the fridge. Perfect to make ahead of the festivities!
- 6. Garnish with more crumbled bacon








Swimming to Antarctica - Lynne Cox


Lynne Cox writes about swimming the way Saint-Exupery wrote about flying, and one sees how swimming, like flying, can stretch the wings of the spirit. At 14, she swam 26 miles from Catalina Island to the mainland; at 15 & 16, she broke the men's and women's world records for swimming the English Channel; at 18, she swam the 20-mile Cook Strait between North and South Islands of New Zealand. 
