Burgee Exchange

Dave and Carmel Fleck are on the Great Loop, a 6000 mile cruise from Florida, up the intracoastal

waterway to New York, across Canada to Lake Michigan, down the rivers to Mobil and back to Florida. Along the way we try to stop at any yacht club that is available and able to dock our 42' Jefferson trawler. This year there have been two clubs that have shown great hospitality and provided shelter from very bad weather when we needed it. So we had a burgee exchange with them.

The first was the Solomon Islands Yacht Club on the Chesapeake Bay in Maryland. We arrived on a fairly windy and rainy day knowing the next few days would be much worse. The club house was warm and inviting with many friendly members we could meet and get to know. Most of these smaller yacht clubs do not have restaurant service but use member volunteers to provide one or two nights of limited food availability. We are always prepared to have our meals on the boat if there is no restaurant within walking distance. Our burgee exchange was with Past Commodore Steve.

The second was the Great Kills Yacht Club on Staten Island in New York. I have to explain that boats do not take the Intracoastal Waterway through New Jersey! It is very poorly

maintained and always a risk for running aground and snagging crab pot floats. Of the 10-12 boats heading north at that time, we know of 2 that had to be pulled off after grounding and one that had to be hauled out to remove crab pot tackle. The route is from Cape May out in the ocean to Atlantic

City; out in the ocean to Manasquan Inlet; out in the ocean around Sandy Hook to NY. Each day is about 50 miles in the Atlantic Ocean. We did not have any good weather days. We waited two extra days in Atlantic City to leave at the top end of our weather window.

We called ahead to John Calascibetta at Great Kills YC for availability since we know other boats would want shelter as well and were able to secure a slip. We arrived about 3 PM very tired and ready for the weekend. It rained all day Saturday but we walked to the neighboring Richmond County Yacht Club for their Commissioning Day (our Opening Day). The new Commodore appreciated a Staff Commodore from the other side of the country attending his special day. On Sunday we used the train and Staten Island Ferry to get to Manhattan to see our friend Robert and attend an off Broadway musical Titanique. We exchanged our burgee with John Calascibetta.





Other Minds - Peter Godfrey-Smith

In *Other Minds*, Peter Godfrey-Smith, a distinguished philosopher of science and a skilled scuba diver, tells a bold new story of how subjective experience crept into being - how nature became aware of itself. 
