### ON THE HORIZON

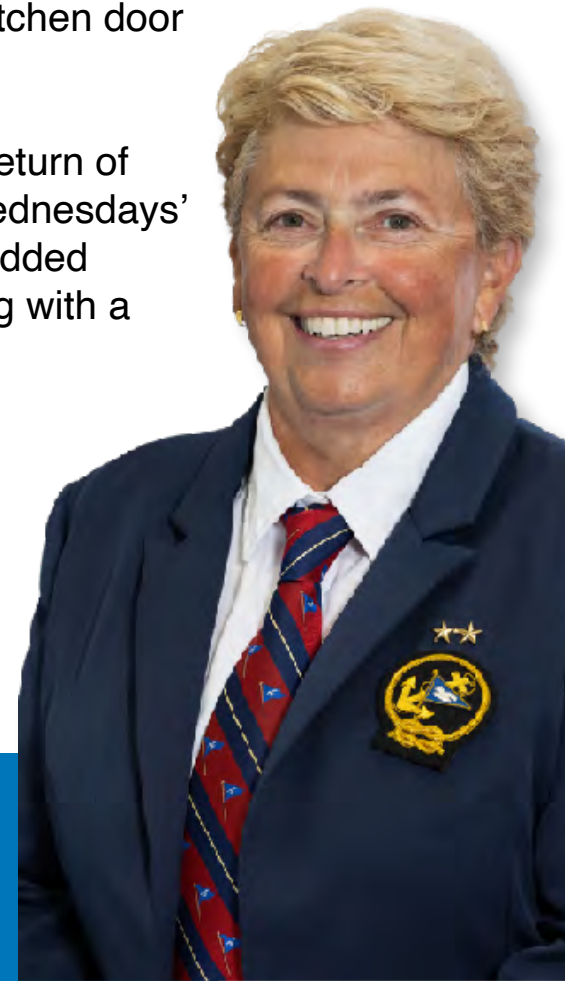
As we shift into the temperatures of fall, we will again be making the central door to the patio become the only door to be opened for seating and service by our staff.

# Make-A-Wish® Amazing Race Event

## 2023 Success

Speaking of which, we know many people had fun participating and we'd love to see more involvement in the committee. And I can attest that this is such a wonderful way you can give back to our community.

So some fun facts....the live auction raised over \$11K, the silent auction raised just under \$10K, raffle ticket sales raised almost \$5K....but the real fundraising comes from the participating teams. The bike and boat teams combined raised over \$55K. Another **amazing** part of the day, which those in attendance may have heard, is that we had a surprise anonymous donation of \$10K made to the event. Combined, all these add up to more than \$90,000 for Make-A-Wish® San Diego, which serves local children diagnosed with critical illnesses in San Diego and Imperial counties. There are currently over 300 local children in the process of receiving a wish and every dollar we raise helps make their wishes come true. Studies have shown that receiving a wish is helpful in their healing process.

Awards were given for those raising the most money, winners of the bike and boat challenges and best dressed.

- CCYC Rockin Riders, led by team captain Becki Lock, won the most money raised by a bike team, bringing in almost \$15K, which means that the perpetual trophy will remain at CCYC for another year! And trust me, it was a neck and neck race with the Navy Blue team days before the event, including the morning of the event. Congratulations to her entire team!
- The Hollipoppers raised the most money of the boat teams bringing in over \$1,400.
- Winner of the bike challenge this year was the ParkLife team, which included a Make-A-Wish family riding in the event. Separated by only one point for first place, second place in the bike challenge went to CCYC Rockin Riders and third place went to Joy Riders.
- Winner of the boat team challenge was Ancora Una Volta led by Angela Witucki followed by the Hollipoppers with second place and Melinda's Memory Makers coming in third place.
- Winner of the best dressed included Melinda's Memory Makers for the boat teams and Mullet Mafia for the bike teams.

Some of the bike and boat challenges included, extreme beer pong, marshmallow eating "chubby bunny" contest, giant Jenga game, San Diego trivia, survivor game, and a coconut relay. Next year's challenges are already being thought of so get ready for more fun!

However, the highlight of the day was when Wish Kid Nora spoke. She was one of our sponsor kids in 2019 and her wish was granted earlier this year (postponed due to the 2020 shut down). Thankfully, her health is good as she is cancer free and currently attending a local university. To the best of my knowledge, there wasn't a dry eye in the house as she spoke. Any nominations from the floor will be accepted at the luncheon. If there are none this slate will be voted upon at the October luncheon.

Proposed By-Law changes: Article VI, 1 paragraph 6, Election of Officers shall be held annually, and Officers shall serve no more than ~~two~~ four successive years in the same office.

Article X – Expenditures section 1, The C-Gulls Captain is authorized, with Purser approval to approve expenditures up to ~~\$250.00~~ \$500.00 without a majority vote from either the officers or the membership.

Article X – Expenditures section 2, Expenditures between ~~\$250.00~~ \$500 and \$1,500 shall be approved by a majority vote of the Officers at a regular or special Board meeting where a quorum is present. Any expenditure over \$1,500 shall be approved by a majority vote of the membership at a regular or special meeting where a quorum is present. If the issue is time sensitive, votes may be conducted by electronic means.

The C-Gulls organization has been in existence since 1974, founded by Riv Tobin. Our purpose is to aid in supplementing the social and fundraising efforts of our club and to encourage female participation in all events. Currently we have 105 members, and always have room for more. There is an application right here in the Navigator ready for you to fill out and drop off in the C-Gulls box as you enter the club. First Mate Linda Hayes is ready to meet with you and answer any questions you may have. We look forward to seeing you at the club and of course at our monthly luncheons.

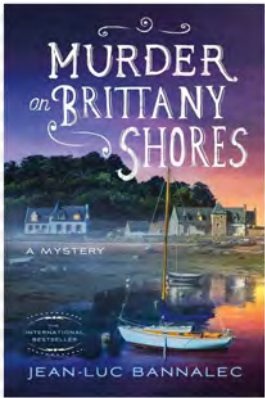

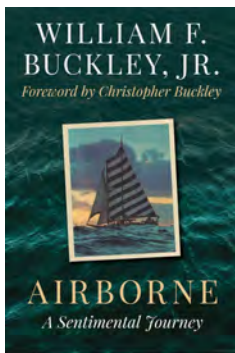

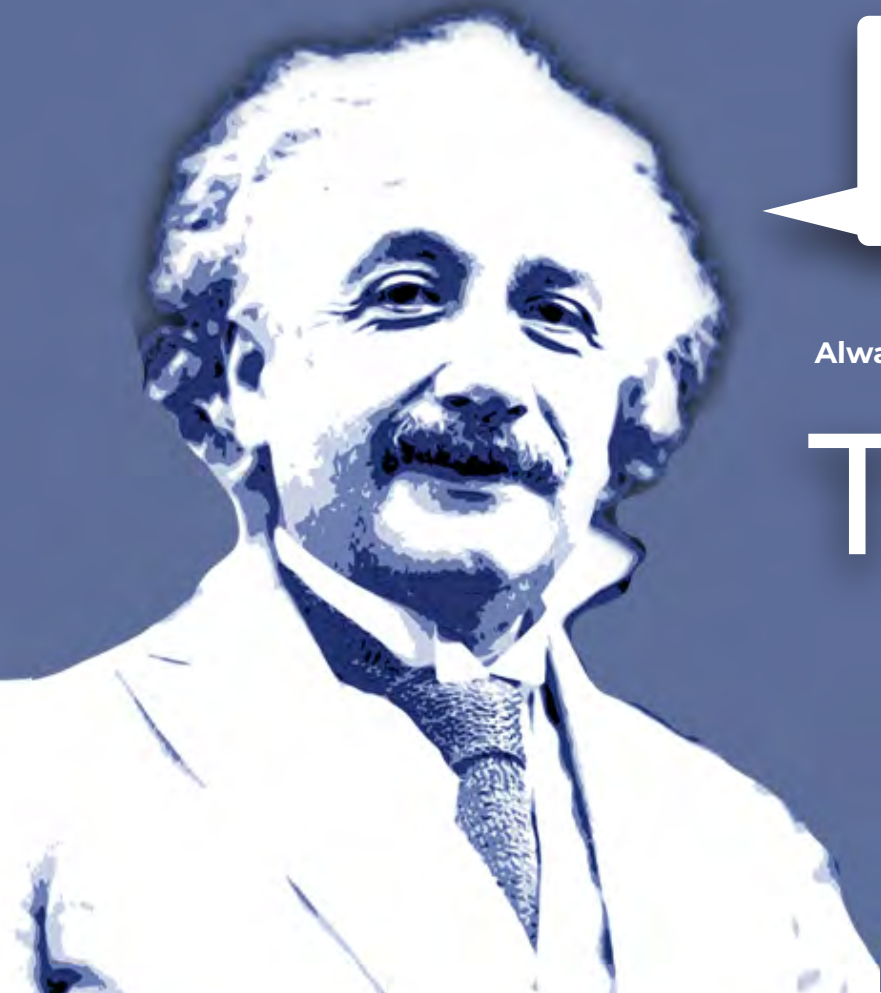
