hanks to those who attended the Marina tenant meeting. We had a great turnout. Revised/updated Marina Rules and Regulations were passed out to those attending and good discussions occurred. The updated rules were reviewed and approved by the Board of Directors several months ago and are substantially the same as previous years with some consolidations.

The key impact to tenants is likely the enforcement of long standing rules related to boat upkeep and participation in club activities. Pride in the appearance of our fleet is a yacht club tradition that needs to be upheld by all. Boat inspections will be resuming, if you haven't had your boat inspected please contact your Dock Captain's or myself to schedule a time.

We currently have two 40' slips available that can handle a 43' LOA. If you've been thinking about a boat under 43' or know of someone on a long waitlist at another yacht club please have them contact me. Our rates are way under market so a new Member's initiation fee amortizes quickly.

We have been working hard to clean up our waitlists, making sure that only those seriously ready to accept a slip at a given length are on the lists. You can check the lists posted in the hallway. I update them monthly.

In an effort to minimize staffing, marina docks have not been washed down in several months. Dan has hired a part-time employee to help get things caught up. If you notice something that needs attention please contact me directly rather than asking a staff member to take care of it. This allows Dan and myself to prioritize and assign tasks.

i everyone. I wanted to share with you the financial results from the fiscal quarter ended May 31.

We ended the guarter with \$595,000 in cash and short term investments, compared to \$542,000 at the end of the first quarter, for an increase of \$53,000. We are in the process of moving most of these funds from low interest short term investments to similar accounts at banks that pay more competitive rates.

Our C Dock expenditures totaled \$930,000, which were funded largely by the \$920,000 loan arranged last year. Roof, sinkhole, and paving repairs totaled \$135,000, fortunately much less than we feared. This was covered by the proceeds from the assessment (\$166,000), with about \$21,000 excess from the assessment reserved for upcoming capital expenditures.



For the first six months of the year we had a profit of \$168,000, with most of that due to the assessment. Ignoring the assessment, we had an operating profit of \$6,000 in the second quarter compared to a loss of \$4,000 for the first quarter. Last year we had a loss of \$33,000 for the six month period before the extraordinary \$100,000 we received from the employee retention credit.

Financial results continue to be affected by our ability to attract events while we have the uncertainty around the grass area we have been renting from our neighbor. Hopefully we are close to a resolution of this issue.

We have implemented most of the of planned Club Essentials services with some of the anticipated confusion. On the accounting side it has streamlined our monthly procedures and should make your bills easier to understand. We all still have some learning to do.

so that we can include you in any group plan information.






